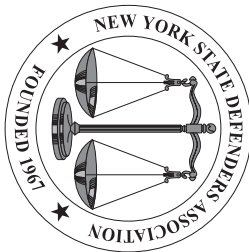

Roshell Amezcua is a Staff Attorney at the Bronx Defenders. Roshell focuses on representing parents with neglect or abuse cases filed against them. Her focus also includes gathering information regarding the overlap between neglect/abuse proceedings and unforeseen collateral immigration consequences for non-citizen clients. Roshell received her law degree from Loyola Law School in Los Angeles, California, where she participated in the Juvenile Justice Clinic in The Center for Juvenile Law and Policy. Before coming to the Bronx Defenders, Roshell worked as a Post Bar Law Clerk in the Appellate Division at the Orange County Public Defender's Office, interned at the Los Angeles Public Defender's Office in the SB-9 Juvenile Division obtaining resentencing hearings for juveniles sentenced to life without parole, and interned in the Mental Health division and Juvenile Division in Compton with the Los Angeles Public Defender's Office. Her goal has been to represent indigent clients in a holistic framework, acknowledging race, gender, and poverty, while attempting to maintain her clients' autonomy and humanity.

Robert Horne currently serves as the Supervising Attorney of the Regional Immigration Assistance Center, Region 4 (RIAC). Prior to joining the RIAC, Mr. Horne has engaged in criminal, immigration and family court representation for over 25 years while in private practice.
